Curriculum Intent

To expand students' knowledge and skills in literature and written expression.

Using the exams as a gateway to allow students to become stronger independent thinkers, have the ability to express themselves in a fluent manner, written and verbally, and use the texts to explore society and humanity. We aim for students to become successful learners who continue to explore and develop ideas that are built upon the Catholic Ethos. We often use the texts at the heart of our curriculum to explore fundamental ideas such as Love, Respect, Honesty, Responsibility and Justice which will then help develop the students so that they are ready to navigate life beyond school with Catholic values underpinning their choices.

In order to accommodate for both GCSE Literature and GCSE Language as separate qualifications, students will sit a weekly lesson on GCSE Language throughout KS4.
